To determine Admissions Arrangements

To communicate details to schools

To set Admissions and Enrolment numbers

#### Role of Education Authority (Southern Region)

To administer the process via Pupil & Parent Unit

#### Roles in the Process

#### **Role of Primary Schools**

- Assist parents with the procedure
- Assist completion of the Transfer Form
- Return Transfer Forms to Education Authority
- Support with Claims for Special Circumstances

#### Role of Boards of Governors (Post-Primary)

- Statutory Admissions Authority
- Draw up & publish Admissions Criteria
- Apply Admissions Criteria
- Fill all places









### Overview

- No Department of Education Transfer Test
- Unregulated admissions system
  - Schools set own Entrance Tests
- Association for Quality Education (AQE)
- Common Entrance Assessment (CEA)









#### Common Entrance Assessment

- Administered by AQE
- Takes account of KS2 Revised Curriculum for English & Mathematics. Science is not included
  - Specification available on the AQE website
- Coaching not required but old Transfer Test papers
   (without the Science) and past AQE papers (available on the AQE website) can serve as practice papers









#### Common Entrance Assessment

• 3 x1 hour papers

Best two papers count

• First Assessment: 11 November 2017

Second Assessment: 25 November 2017

Third Assessment: 2 December 2017









#### Common Entrance Assessment

• Papers designed in consultation with teaching professionals at primary level

- Charge £48.00
  - Waived for those on Free School Meals
- Equal marks allocated to Maths & English
- No Science items









## Taking the Test

- Tests held in Grammar Schools
- Not Primary Schools
- Nominate preference when registering
- Informed in advance of venue
- No bearing on eventual Post-Primary school
- Familiarisation visit(s) arranged in October









## Marking

- Each paper marked three times
- By different markers
- Quality Assured
- Opportunity to apply for re-mark











#### Results

• Best 2 out of 3 forms the final result

• Age standardised scores (as in Transfer Test)

• Issued to arrive on Saturday 27 January 2018











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## Registration Arrangements

 Registration Forms from AQE office, Banbridge Academy or AQE website

- Choice of Test Centre
  - NO bearing on application for a place but Test Centres allocated on a first come first served basis
- Detailed notes accompany Registration Form









## Registration Arrangements

- Form returned to AQE office
- No later than 8 September 2017
- Photocopy of Birth Certificate
- 3 Passport Photographs
- Cheque/Postal order/Banker's Draft for £48.00
- Letter from EA confirming FSME (if applicable)









### Application for Access Arrangements

- Section B on application form
- Give brief details
- Parent sent an Access Application Form
- Parental responsibility to return to AQE by deadline
- Decision made by a panel of assessors
- Decision sent to parents
- Decision sent to Test Centre
- Appropriate arrangements made









### Registration

- Receive a laminated Admission Card
- Details of School Test Centre
- Information about the Test
- Participating Schools receive details of assessment applications









## Taking the Test in Banbridge Academy

- Accommodation in classrooms
- Pupils with others from same Primary School
- Invigilators will follow common AQE procedures (adapted from JCQ & CCEA)
- Instructions clearly announced
- Time elapsed announced









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# January / February 2018

- Results Issued: 27 January 2018
- Application for re-marks
- Meetings with Primary Principals
- Transfer Forms completed
  - Including details of Special Circumstances/Special Provisions
- Transfer Forms sent to Education Authority









# March-May 2018

- Transfer Forms processed
- Post-Primary schools receive forms
- Schools apply Admissions Criteria
- Decisions are made
- Parents informed of allocated schools
- Appeals process opens









# Banbridge Academy

- Unregulated system not our preferred option
- The current position is not of our choosing
- We would prefer a test run and administered by DE
- The Board of Governors will continue to have regard to the DE's Guidance











# Entry to Banbridge Academy

• Result of the AQE test will be the first criterion

• To improve the chances of your son/daughter gaining entry to Banbridge Academy in September 2018 he/she **must** sit the AQE test









#### Admissions Criteria Transfer 2017

#### Applied by Board of Governors' Education Committee

- 1. Rank order of AQE scores
- 2. Admissions Number 184
- 3. If number of applicants exceeds the places:
  - (i) Sibling & Eldest
  - (ii) Primary School within former BDC
  - (iii) Primary School outside former BDC
- 4. Tie Breaker: Random

- Don't make assumptions about scores
- No cut off score
- Rank order
- 184 Places
