We began 2023-2024 with a strong preseason block, building momentum toward the All-Ireland Schools' Tournament. Confident performances in friendly games leading up to the All Irelands' matches kept team morale high as we played impressive hockey, continually improving and refining our skills.

All-Ireland Schools' Tournament

The tournament presented us with some challenges, particularly with scoring goals. The tournament started with dominant performances against Sullivan Upper and King's Hospital, but goals were scarce in both fixtures. The final group stage match was our closest of the season, ending in a draw against Newtown School, who had a formidable Spanish goal scorer. This draw meant the group winner was decided on goal difference, with Newtown edging us out by one goal. This was a disheartening exit from the main competition, despite our dominant play. As a result, we entered the subsidiary competition, the Herbie Sharman.

We regrouped and set new goals for the final day of the competition. The semi-final against local rivals Friends' School Lisburn mirrored previous games, with us controlling possession and scoring multiple goals in the second half, securing our place in the final. Facing St Andrew's in the final, we started strong with an early goal and maintained pressure. Despite St Andrew's equalizing early in the second half, we prevailed in

run-ins to win the Herbie Sharman Perpetual Trophy.

McCullough Cup

After a brief two-week break, the McCullough Cup began with a new group stage format and Mr Jess had us revigorated and ready to go. We displayed dominance and control in the group games, comfortably advancing to the semi-finals despite a tough match against RBAI, which ended our unbeaten streak. We topped the group on goal difference, leading us to face Friends' in the semi-final. This one-sided match saw us maintaining possession and momentum, securing a spot in the final against Wallace. The final was tightly contested, but we capitalized on our opportunities to become McCullough Cup winners, with Lukas Moles earning Man of the Match for his performance and assisting on the winning goal.

Burney Cup

Following the Christmas break, the Burney Cup marked the final competition of the school season. Early in the new year, the team was plagued with injuries, affecting our tactics near the opposing goal. Despite this setback, we maintained control and dominance in the initial cup games, playing great flowing hockey. As a high-ranked team, we received a bye to the Quarter-Final, where we faced a strong Bangor Grammar side. We neutralized their short corner threat by maintaining possession and dominating the match, conceding only one goal while scoring six. This secured our place in the next round against Sullivan, where we again demonstrated dominance, albeit without a



flashy scoreline due to Sullivan's excellent goalkeeping.

The final was our third match of the season against old rivals RBAI; the only team we had lost to. In the late evening at Stormont, a great crowd witnessed a thrilling match. RBAI came out strong, converting two short corners into goals in the first half. After a big regroup and refocus at halftime, Banbridge shifted the match's momentum but couldn't break down opposition in the third quarter. In the last quarter, our persistent pressure resulted in a clinical goal, energizing the crowd. The final ten minutes saw chance after chance for Banbridge, but despite our efforts, we couldn't find the equalizer. The final whistle blew, and Banbridge had to settle for second place in the Burney Cup.

The season was filled with a lot of highs and a few couple lows, showcasing our team's resilience and skill. We achieved significant victories, winning the Herbie Sharman, McCullough Cup and making the Burney Cup Final. It is a true showcase of the talent and commitment of the team.


