

Dear Parent

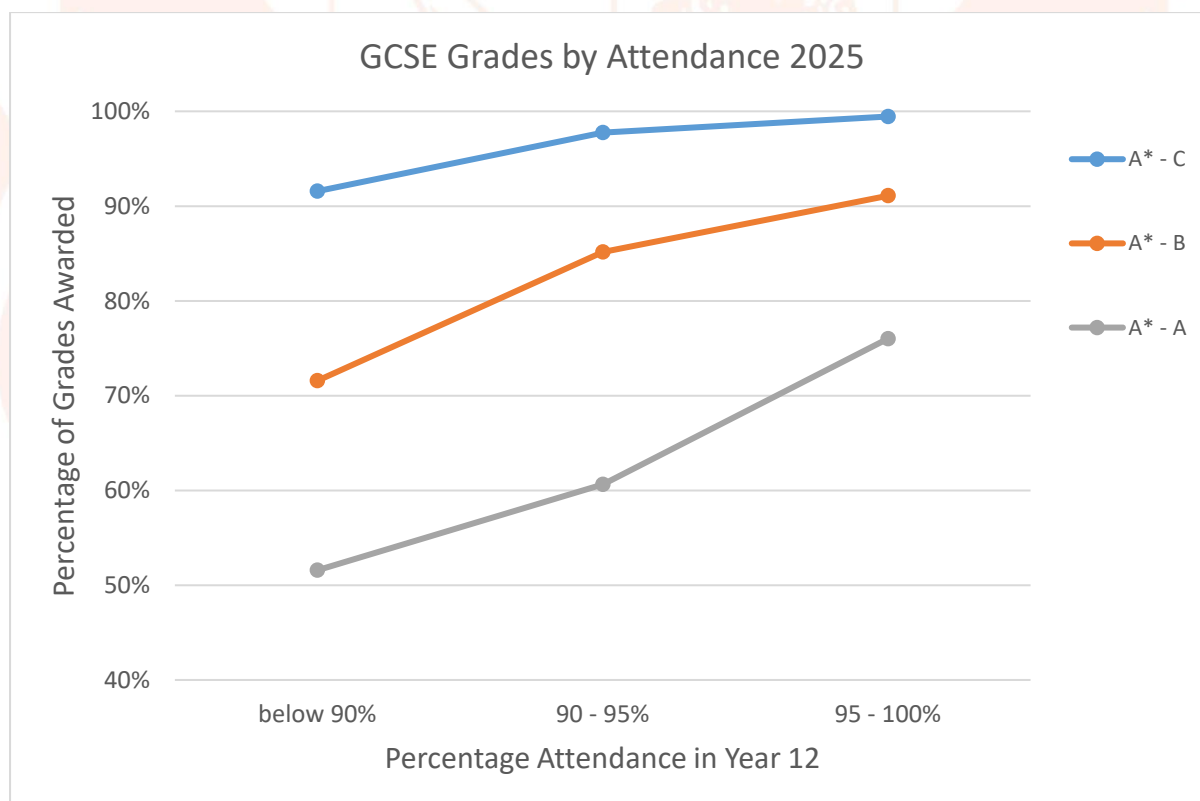
As I have previously highlighted, attendance at school is vital to enable a young person to achieve their potential. Good attendance is not only linked to academic achievement but is connected to pupils' emotional health and wellbeing and supports them to thrive as adults in their local community. Whilst at school young people learn, make new friends, experience new things in life, gain qualifications, build confidence and self-esteem which all feed in to giving them the best start in life.

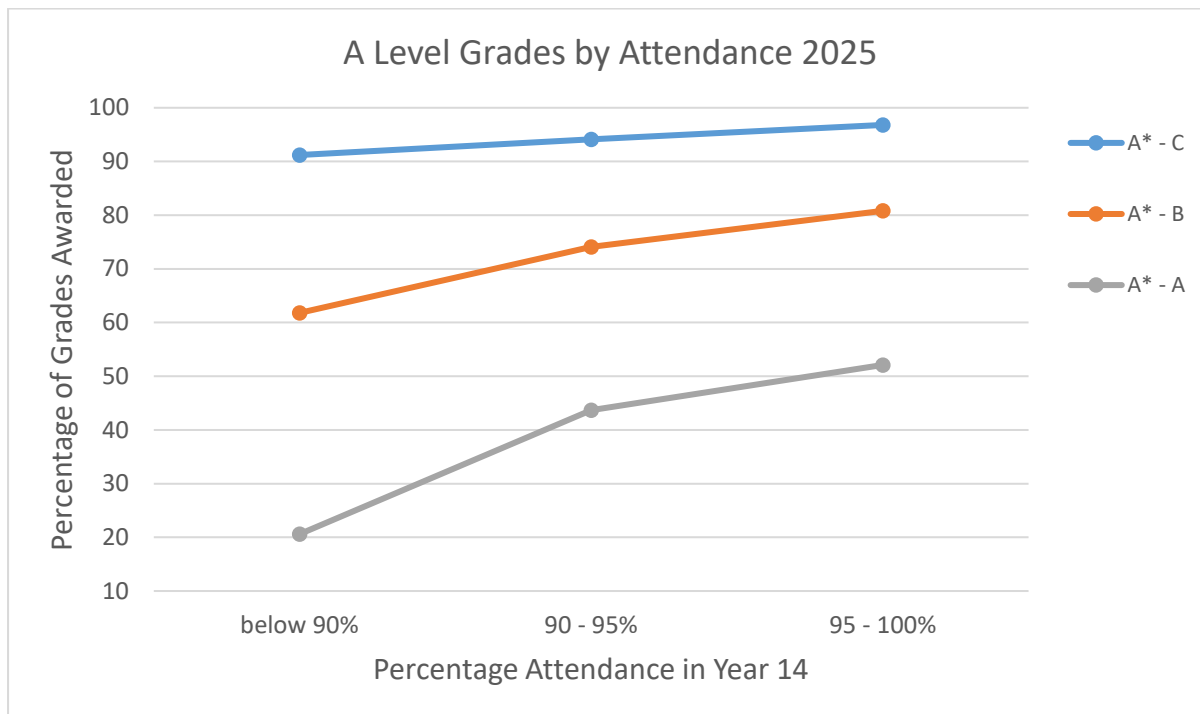
As a school, we monitor attendance very closely and our whole-school attendance figure for 2024-25 was 95.9% and our target for this year is 96%. Attendance percentages can be somewhat misleading, however, and whilst 95% may sound like a high figure, it is important to highlight how even minor absences can have significant impacts on a young person's attainment and personal development.

For example

- **95% attendance equates to almost two weeks of learning missed during a school year.**
- **90% attendance is the same as missing one day of school every two weeks, which equates to almost four weeks of teaching missed. This is the equivalent of 120 guided learning hours- the same length of time as allocated to studying one full-time GCSE.**

As a school, we conducted an analysis of our examination results compared to school attendance and the results are outlined below.






We would ask for your support in making sure that your son/daughter is present in school every day by
